




## Four Extraordinary Homes That Capture the Many Faces of Luxury Right Now


### "My Paradise" on the Water at 720 Lugo Avenue

Coral Gables, Florida | \$22,500,000





At the far end of a quiet street inside the guard-gated enclave of Gables by the Sea, a waterfront estate known as My Paradise lives up to its name in every sense. Listed for \$22.5 million by Jill Eber and Judy Zeder of [The Jills Zeder Group](#), the property delivers a rare combination of scale, privacy, and panoramic water views that define the best of South Florida living.





Set on a massive 32,025-square-foot lot with approximately 250 feet of waterfront exposure, the estate is uniquely positioned to capture both sunrise and sunset views across Biscayne Bay. Mornings unfold over open water and protected preserve land, while evenings bring glowing skies that stretch toward Miami Beach, Key Biscayne, and even the Atlantic horizon.

The home itself spans 3,968 square feet and is elevated for both views and peace of mind. A gated coral stone entry framed by mature landscaping provides immediate seclusion, while multiple on-site parking areas accommodate up to 15 vehicles - an entertainer's dream without compromising curb appeal.

For boating enthusiasts, the property delivers serious infrastructure. A newly built 66-foot IPE wood dock includes a boat lift, electric hookups, outdoor sink, and a boathouse complete with storage, maintenance space, and a full bathroom. Plans are already in motion to extend the dock and seawall by an additional 34 feet, creating a 100-foot dock capable of accommodating larger vessels.

Inside, the home balances warmth with openness. The main living room features refined millwork and a pitch-to-peak wood-beam ceiling with skylights that flood the space with natural light. A wet bar opens directly to the pool deck, reinforcing the home's effortless indoor-outdoor flow. The formal dining area showcases custom millwork and etched glass nature motifs, while the kitchen offers custom cabinetry, a granite island, Bosch cooktop, Sub-Zero refrigeration, and another skylit, beam-accented ceiling.

The bay-side primary suite is designed for daily indulgence, with cedar-lined his-and-hers closets, a flexible anteroom, and a spa-like bath featuring dual sinks, an open shower, and a sunken soaking tub positioned to enjoy tranquil water views. Additional features include a dehumidified garage, insulated attic and crawl space, and a whole-home generator, ensuring comfort and resilience year-round.
